## Let's Be Glad He Was Born - Whenever It Was! (Part 2)

Certain special days and seasons of the year pose problems at times for Christians because of their personal beliefs and opinions (see Romans 14:5-7; Colossians 2:16-17). In this present age, in following Christ, some convictions become clear to Christians who are really dedicated and sincere, and they do not mind holding to them in order to be faithful to Christ, even if they are misunderstood, ridiculed, or even persecuted in doing so.

This was the case with the first Christians. They had even more trouble than we do. Their world was thoroughly pagan. Some of them had formerly been pagans. To make a complete break from paganism was not easy. However, not all ties were broken (see above scriptures). Participation in all activities with non-Christian friends was not forbidden. Sometimes Christians continued to live with pagan spouses (1 Corinthians 7). Paul observed some Jewish national customs that did not cause him to deny Christ. He taught Christians at Corinth that there is only one true God and that an idol is nothing (1 Corinthians 8:4). At the same time, he taught that as long as they had that truth clear in their minds, their participation in social activities, even in things that had their origin with idolatry, was not wrong unless conditions were imposed on them that gave honor to the idol and denied God (1 Corinthians 10:28-29).

That is why Christians can use words like Sunday, Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, Saturday, December, January, February, March, etc., with no problem as far as their convictions and influence are concerned. Though all of those terms, and many more we use, were all once connected with paganism and idolatry, they carry no such connotation now. They are merely holdovers from an ancient past that throw no informed Christian for a loop when he encounters them. Rituals such as rice at weddings or little children dressing as ghosts to go trick-or-treating are not understood by any informed person to threaten belief in the one God. Thanksgiving day is not a sacred holiday, but it is not un-Christian to thank God on that day. Many holiday customs in December have lost any significance to pagan roots and have become only national or family customs. Meaning of the terms and the original intent of such customs have changed completely through the years.

Though we do not know when Jesus was born, it is not wrong for Christians to thank God for "His indescribable gift" (2 Corinthians 9:15) anytime, including December when many others do. It is certainly a Bible truth that the baby Jesus was born, and we should be thankful for that reality. We also believe in Jesus all year long, 365 days a year. Once a year, if only for a moment, many people in our world stop to reflect on the birth of the baby Jesus. I wonder what Paul would do if he were with us today. I personally believe he would seize the opportunity afforded by this season and preach Jesus, from the wonderful Kodak moment of the manger scene through His death, burial, and resurrection. As a preacher, and His disciple, why would I (we) want to discourage anyone from thinking about Jesus, singing about Jesus, or remembering Jesus at anytime, anyplace, or anywhere? No one should ever be happier about the coming of Christ at any time of the year than His own people.

Please remember that I'm not saying that terminology never matters nor that "anything goes". There surely are limits and "weightier matters" that call for concern, but we seem to let trivialities trip us up long before we ever get to them. The important thing is to keep stressing that "there is no other God but one and an idol is nothing"! When we get that straight, along with the conviction that God sent His Son, Jesus, into the world to save us, we will not have to tip-toe through minefields of terminology. We can even use the word "Thursday" without worrying that anybody thinks we are endorsing worship of Thor! He was nothing; Christ is everything. **Let us be glad Jesus came - whenever it was.**
